

He made his first profession on December 25, 1938 at Tirupattur and ordained on 07 September 1948



Fr. Lazar is no more with us. We are indeed saddened by the demise of one of our confreres who served the congregation and the Church for 59 long years. Fr. Lazar had not been well in the recent past. Knowing that he was becoming weaker day by day, we had sent him for a medical check-up during the last month. After about 10 days of treatment and rest at St. Thomas Hospital, he came back exuberant and invigorated. So much so, for a few days, he was in high spirits and continually came out with witty remarks and didnot hesitate to pull the legs of young confreres. He kept saying that he was 81 years old in age but that his spirit was 18 years young. He had already suggested in a lighter vein, that we set up a committee that will look after the Golden Jubilee celebration of his priestly ordination to have been celebrated next year.

But, we were shocked to find that this exuberance and good health were short-lived. Already from the 11th of this month, he had no appetite, was constantly troubled by cold and cough. He started confining himself to his room more and more and avoided eating solid food. When we suggested that he must be admitted to the hospital, he declined saying that he was alright.

On the 17th, we convinced him that he needed hospital treatment and so he was admitted in St. Thomas Hospital on the 18th. Even then, he remarked that he would remain there only for 4 or 5 days and then he would return to the community. In the evening, he spoke to the sisters, salesians and the relatives who were around him and then told them that he wanted to rest. It was around 7.30p.m. He just lay back on the pillow and breathed his last.

Fr. Lazar had expressed his wish that he be buried near the tomb of his mother in St. Rock's cemetry. So, on the 19th, funeral mass was celebrated at St. Francis Xavier's Church, Broadway at 4.30 p.m. Our Bishops M. Rev. Chinnappa and M. Rev. Joseph Antony were there to celebrate the Eucharist. And at 7.00 p.m. the mortal remains of Fr. Lazar was buried at St. Rock's cemetry.

Fr. Lazar Sournaraj was the eldest of the two sons of Mr. Joseph and Mrs. Anthoniammal. He was born on 1st, February, 1916 in Chennai. He made his first profession on 25th, December 1938. He was ordained by Msgr. Thomas Pothakamury on 7th Sepember, 1948. His priestly ministry was begun as the parish priest of Tirupattur.

After serving in Don Bosco, Vellore for 11 years, he was made the Vicar General of the diocese of Vellore from 1966 onwards. During the vacancy of the See, he was entrusted with the responsibility of being the Prefect Apostolic and Diocesan Administrator upto the year 1971. The priests, sisters and lay people of Vellore diocese remember him with gratitude and fondness for the wonderful service he had done there. Then he served as parish priest in Ayanavaram, Peravallur and at St. Mary's Co-Cathedral. It was from 1988 that he was appointed as confessor first at Sacred Heart Seminary, Poonamalle and later at Don Bosco, Tirupattur. From 1994 onwards, due to ill-health and old age, he has been residing at the Citadel.

We have lost a very committed and zealous religious in Fr.Lazar. His whole life was one of commitment and service for God's kingdom. The oft-repeated words on his lips were fidelity and commitment. Fidelity to Christ was the motto of his life. His whole life was centred around this principle. He would say that the whole of his priestly ministry was geared towards spreading God's kingdom. Many priests and sisters say that they owe their vocation to Fr.Lazar. It was not rare to find sisters and lay people asking Fr.Lazar, "Thandhai, do you remember, you were my catechism teacher?", "Thandhai, it is you who sent me to the convent".

Fidelity to our charism was another important aspect of his character, whether he was working for the Diocese or as a parish priest, the salesian charism was very evident in his apostolate and in the way he dealt with the people.

Fr. Lazar was a very good leader. He did a wonderful job as the Diocesan Administrator of the diocese of Vellore. Along with his meticulous administration and emphasis on disclipined life, there was one other quality for which people remember him-the fatherly way he fulfilled all his duties. Many priests, sisters and the lay people, especially in the diocese of Vellore, fondly remember him for his fatherliness and befittingly called him 'Thandhai'. This quality was most expressed in the confessional, wherein he was very much sought after.

Rousseau had remarked, "When a man dies he clutches in his hands only that which he has given away in his life time." Fr. Lazar had given so much of himself, his energy and service to the Congregation and to the Church. His hands must now be very full, as he stands before his Master, with all that he has done and achieved for the kingdom. We are sure that God will render him the 'hundredfold" that He promised his faithful and committed followers. May he rest in God's love and peace. We are grateful to The Citadel community for their love and care and especially to Mr. Dass who looked after him. Let us continue to pray for the soul of Fr. Lazar.
