Fr. William Joseph Chadwick SDB died peacefully in the loving care of the Sisters and staff at Nazareth House,

Hammersmith, London on the 9th March 1993. Fr. William was born in Templemore, Co. Tipperary, on the 4th January 1907 and died in the 70th year of his religious profession and the 56th of priesthood.

He entered the Novitiate at Cowley, Oxford in 1922 and made his First Profession there in September 1923.

He came to Battersea in 1929 as a Cleric having graduated at Oxford University mainly in Geography as there was no honours school of Geography at Oxford at that time. He remained teaching in the school until 1965, a total of 37 years, 25 of which he was Headmaster. Still at Battersea, he was ordained in 1934 and became 'Catechist' in 1937.

In 1939 the school was evacuated to Cowley, Oxford, in consequence of the war. Father William went with them. The then headmaster, Fr. James Hickey, moved to Burwash as rector and Fr. William became headmaster in September 1940.

He then had periods at Cowley and Bolton as Rector, returning to Cowley again as Bursar, finally returning to Battersea in 1973.

Here he spent the last 20 years of his life totalling 57 years as a member of the Battersea community.

During his long and active life he enjoyed extremely good health. He enjoyed sport and was a keen and competent tennis player.

I don't know if he ever had a day off school. I think he told me once that he had never missed a single day offering Holy Mass until the last years of his life, when he was afflicted both with Alzheimers disease and Parkinsons disease. He bore the disability which resulted from these with great patience and serenity.

The most fitting tribute I can share with you is to quote from some of the many letters received in response to our notification of his death. These give an overall witness to a life shared with and for others.

"I want to write at once to record my appreciation of a remarkable man . . . Fr. Chadwick was not only a man dedicated to the progress of the school but was able to take a deep personal interest in each of the pupils – all of whom he knew intimately. His firm discipline combined easily with a unique style of humour and with a great concern for the welfare of all connected with the school. He always appeared to be motivated by an enthusiasm to put into practice the principles of his founder, Don Bosco, for whom he had such an obviously deep affection and

devotion."
